Shrubs

American Currant, *Ribes americanum*

Description: Low-growing shrub with small, white flowers. Produces sweet, black, seedy fruit ideal for jam, jelly, and pies.

Landscaping: Full to partial sun. Prefers moist soils. Grows up to 3' – 6' tall. Optimum spacing 5' between plants.

Zone 3

Source/Size: Big Sioux Nursery/12-20" bare-root



Bearberry/Kinnikinnick Berry, *Arctostaphylos uva-ursi*

Description: A low-lying evergreen shrub with multiple stems, leathery leaves, small white tinged pink flowers, and bright red edible berries. Makes a good ground cover.

Landscaping: Filtered shade to full sun. Tolerates drought conditions.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/3-6" plug



Blizzard Mock Orange, *Philadelphus lewisii* 'Blizzard'

Description: Named for cold hardiness and "blizzard" of fragrant blooms, covering the plant in late spring/early summer. Grows up to 10 feet.

Landscaping: Prefers sun to part shade and well-drained soil.

Zone 3

Source/Size: Brons & Sons/potted



Golden Currant, *Ribes aureum*

Description: Ornamental shrub with fragrant, yellow trumpet flowers. Produces sweet, golden, seedy fruit in 3 years—ideal for jams & pie.

Landscaping: Full to partial sun. Prefers moist soils. Optimum spacing 5'.

Zone 3

Source/Size: Big Sioux Nursery/12-20" bare-root



Iris, *Iris setosa*

Description: A 12-24" tall perennial with blue-violet flowers.

Landscaping: Plant in full sun to partial shade and moist soil.

Zone 1

Source/Size: North Country Farm/3"x3" plugs



Killarney Raspberry, *Rubus idaeus* 'Killarney'

Description: Cold hardy raspberry with early ripening red fruit.

Landscaping: Prefers full sun, soil pH of 6.2-6.8, suggested planting in raised beds to promote good drainage, trellising encouraged. 4-6' tall, 1-2' spacing.

Zone 3

Source/Size: Alaska Berries/bare-root with 1/4" to 1/2" diameter stems



Red Osier Dogwood, *Cornus sericea*

Description: Deciduous shrub with many red stems, grows small white flowers and berries, ideal for holding soil on steep banks.

Landscaping: Prefers moist soils with moderate to full sun exposure.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/2-3' bare-root



Rose Tree of China, *Prunus triloba*

Description: Small tree/large shrub with many single pink/white flowers. Foliage turns yellow-bronze in fall.

Landscaping: Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Flowers best in full sun.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/18-24" bare-root



Silverberry, *Elaeagnus commutata*

Description: A medium-sized shrub with silvery foliage, red berries, and small yellow flowers. Has a perfume-like scent.

Landscaping: Plant in full sun, this plant is somewhat drought tolerant.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Brons & Sons/potted



Trees

Amur Maple, *Acer ginnala*

Description: A small shrubby tree with glossy foliage and fragrant spring blooms. Has bright red fall leaves.

Landscaping: Prefers well drained soil and full sun to partial shade.

Zone 3

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/18-24" bare-root



Birch, *Betula neoalaskana*

Description: Deciduous tree with white, peeling bark and golden fall color.



Landscaping: Prefers moist, well-drained soils, tolerates partial shade.

Zone 1

Source/Size: Pingo Farm/1-4' bare-root



Late Lilac, *Syringa villosa*

Description: Hardy small shrubby tree with purple-white fragrant flowers. Grows quickly.

Landscaping: Prefers well-drained soil and full sun.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/2-3' bare-root



Manchurian Crabapple, *Malus baccata* 'Mandshurica'

Description: Small tree with fragrant white flowers & edible fruits that are good for baking/preserves.

Landscaping: Plant in full sun and well-drained soils.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/12-18" bare-root



Nanking Cherry, *Prunus tomentosa*

Description: Cold hardy, small tree/shrub with pink to white blooms and scarlet-red fruit. Tart, tangy fruit good for preserves.

Landscaping: Full to partial sun. Prefers well-drained soils, but tolerates drought.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Lawyer Nursery/ 12-18" bare-root



Siberian Larch, *Larix sibirica*

Description: A medium sized deciduous conifer with golden fall color.

Landscaping: Plant in sun to partial shade. Water regularly.

Zone 2

Source/Size: American Society of Foresters/ 6-12" plug



White Spruce, *Picea glauca*

Description: Tall evergreen tree, very hardy but slow growing.

Landscaping: Prefers full to partial sun. Don't plant close to home for fire safety.

Zone 2

Source/Size: Risse Greenhouse/6-8" in cones



Raspberries Info (Alaska Berries Website):

Soil pH values 6.2 to 6.8 are best. Raspberries do not like wet feet, so we suggest planting in raised beds. Plant the transplants by making a furrow several inches deep in your row. Lay out the roots parallel in the row spaced about a foot apart and cover lightly with soil. Rows should be 6-8 feet apart. The depth should be 1 inch above the level where the cane emerges from the roots. Do not stomp or pack the soil. Raspberries prefer full sun. Do not fertilize them the first year. Fertilize each spring with 3 pounds of 8-32-16 per 100 sq feet. Trellised raspberries will have higher yields. You will have a raspberry harvest the following year. After harvest, prune out the fruited canes leaving 6-8 pencil size or bigger canes per foot.
